Their stories interweave on stage, threading in and around each other's lives, until the unexpected and touching conclusion to this striking tale by one of Ireland's greatest playwrights.

MEET THE CAST



ELAINE POLEMENAKOS (Molly Sweeney) Elaine's involvement with Center Stages includes *The Miracle Worker, August: Osage County, A Streetcar Named Desire, Arsenic and Old Lace,* and *Moonlight and Magnolias.* A financial advisor at Merrill Lynch, Elaine earned her BA in psychology from Texas A&M University and her J.D. from University of Texas School of Law, putting her in the perfect position to play Molly and understand the characters and their choices.



MITCH LEVINGS (Mr. Rice) Last seen at Center Stages in *Arsenic and Old Lace*, Mitch has a BS in chemical engineering and works as a Performance Engineer at NRG's WA Parish Generating Station. "Given the impacts of COVID-19 on the social scene, it's exciting to be able to present live theater in a way that can be safe for both the actors and the audience. I hope that audiences will find the case study of Molly Sweeney an enjoyable and thought-provoking insight on the fears and expectations of moving from the known to the unknown and to question the difference between seeing and understanding."



CRAIG A. FRITZ (Frank Sweeney) Some of his favorite roles at Center Stages: *Deathtrap, Rumors, The Last of Mrs. Lincoln, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, The Glass Menagerie, The Foreigner,* and *Dividing the Estate.* Craig says that although the casts rehearsed virtually, there is still a "sense of ensemble and togetherness, even though none of the actors interact with one another whatsoever, it's special in that it's a beautiful blend of monologues that create a whole story." When Craig isn't volunteering at Center Stages, he works as a Specialty Courts Program Supervisor for Brazoria County.



WESLEY COPELAND (Director) Since we got lucky and Wes joined us at Center Stages, he has directed *Arsenic and Old Lace, Hairspray, Sweeney Todd, Picasso at the Lapin Agile,* and *Arcadia,* among others. Wes taught theater at Fort Settlement Middle School in Fort Bend ISD, Freeport Intermediate and Clute Intermediate before becoming the Executive Director of The Center for the Arts & Sciences. Wes says that *Molly Sweeney* tells the story of a woman who has been blind for most of her life, meaning she has experienced the world in a way that is different from other people; ultimately, the show reminds us that our differences should be accepted, even celebrated.


