THE STORY

The show is a modern retelling of Homer's *The Iliad*. Having traveled across eons, the seemingly immortal "Poet" transforms into mythical characters found in the ancient story of the battle of Troy. Thoughtprovoking and often humorous, the production examines the horrors of war throughout history alongside poignant commentary on the hopes and dreams of warriors. It uses this ancient story to make us consider our own choices between a wasteful rage or a peaceful existence.

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MEET THE CAST



BOBBY BRITTON (The Poet) Bobby has appeared in BCS productions of *Camelot, Sweeney Todd, 1776*, and *Hairspray*. He has his BA in Theatre from Stephen F. Austin State University, where he appeared in *Spamalot, Bloody Bloody Andrew Jackson, Clybourne Park*, and *Macbeth*, and his MA in Theatre Education from Emerson College in Boston. He is the theater teacher for Freeport Intermediate and Clute Intermediate. Like The Poet, Bobby feels a calling to tell his story: before Covid-19, he was developing and performing a gospel cabaret show based on his experiences with conversion therapy. WESLEY COPELAND (The Poet) You've seen Wes acting at Center Stages in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, Our Town, The Crucible, A Christmas Carol, The Nerd.* Most recently he directed *Hairspray, The Music Man* and *Arsenic and Old Lace.* Wes has his BFA in Theatre from Stephen F. Austin State University and is the executive director of The Center for the Arts and Sciences. Wes says that "In a divisive and difficult time, community theater allows participants to come together, share vulnerabilities, and build trust and connection with others. 

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
HAVING OUR SAY: The Delany Sisters' First 100 Years - May 14-23, 2021

YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN - July 9-18, 2021


